WHAT IS INFUSION THERAPY?

There are many different ways to take medicine. Often your medicine comes in a pill you swallow, but not all health conditions can be treated with this kind of medicine. Infusion therapy is a way to deliver medication, nutrition or hydration support into your bloodstream through your vein. This type of medication delivery, called intravenous, IV or infusion therapy, has become a common and effective way to manage many health conditions.

Infusion therapy is offered in hospitals, doctors' offices, infusion suites and home settings. Many people begin their infusion therapy in a hospital before transitioning to an infusion suite or their home.

Home infusion therapy is often an excellent option for people managing a chronic illness or an infection, recovering from surgery or treating other health conditions. After you are discharged from the hospital, you can safely, conveniently and comfortably get the medication you need without leaving your home.

Advantages to Home Infusion Therapy

There are several advantages to home infusion therapy. People who receive infusion therapy from home are likely to have fewer complications, better clinical outcomes and a greater level of overall comfort than people who receive infusion therapy in a hospital.* This safe alternative is also more convenient. FROM HOSPITAL TO HOME

When you and your doctor transition your infusion therapy from the hospital to your home, Amber Specialty Pharmacy will be with you every step of the way. Before leaving the hospital, most patients will meet with an Amber Specialty Pharmacy liaison who will offer training and support to help coordinate care throughout your transition.

In most cases, you will receive the first delivery of your medication and supplies before you leave the hospital. While you are there, your Amber Specialty Pharmacy liaison will train you to store and administer your medicine.

After you leave the hospital, your next scheduled dose of medicine and supplies will arrive at your home. Amber Specialty Pharmacy coordinates with couriers and delivery services to make sure you have your medication and supplies when you need them. Everything will be packaged and shipped with care to ensure your supplies arrive safely and on time.

A team of Amber Specialty Pharmacy benefit coordinators and billing specialists will contact your insurance provider and help you handle the financial side of care so you can focus on getting better.

Before your discharge or when you are settled in at home, an Amber Specialty Pharmacy health care concierge will call you with more information and answer all your questions about home infusion therapy. During this conversation, you will discuss medication delivery and storage, and review whom to contact if you need help.

Amber Specialty Pharmacy will coordinate your home care visits with your home health care nursing agency and arrange a time for you to meet with a licensed home health care professional. These men and women are licensed nurse practitioners (LPN) and registered nurses (RN) who work with Amber Specialty Pharmacy to deliver exceptional care right to your front door. Your home health care nurse will walk you through the infusion process step by step, offering expert guidance and answering all your questions. They will also take care of your IV dressing changes, draw lab samples and help with other aspects of your clinical care. If you have a caregiver, this training is also an opportunity for them to learn about your infusion therapy. Amber Specialty Pharmacy and your home health care nurse will provide you and your caregiver with resources and infusion tips to help you administer the medication on your own.

Soon after you start your home infusion therapy, an Amber Specialty Pharmacy pharmacist will contact you and address any questions or concerns. Amber Specialty Pharmacy pharmacists are clinical experts who specialize in infusion therapy. Your pharmacist will answer questions about your medication, address side effects if appropriate and coordinate with your doctor to make sure you receive the best care available.
